## OFFICE HOURS

The normal office hours are from 09.30 until 17.30, Mondays to Fridays. However, outside the Cricket Season, offices close at 16.30 on Fridays.

**The Membership Office and Club Facilities Department** are situated in the Pavilion Basement.

**The Membership Office** is responsible for all matters relating to Membership, including subscriptions, categories of Membership and nominations and endorsement of prospective Candidates.

**The Club Facilities Department** is responsible for car parking; reserved seats for elderly and disabled Members; the Golf, Bridge, Chess and Backgammon Societies; and overseas Supporters' Tours.

**The Ticket Office** is situated behind the Museum and next to No.6 Car Park.

**The Ticket Office** is responsible for the allocation and sale of tickets (including Rover Tickets) for all matches at Lord's.

## PAVILION OPENING HOURS

The rapidly-changing Covid-19 situation means that the Pavilion opening hours in 2021 will be decided as required in line with government advice, to ensure the safety of all Pavilion users. Members will be advised of the Pavilion opening hours when information is available.

## GROUND OPENING AND CLOSING TIMES

Whilst the Club very much hopes to maintain the past arrangements for Members in terms of gate opening times for matches played at Lord's in 2021, it is not possible at the time of publication of this booklet to confirm this information. Further details of these times will be confirmed in future communications issued by the Club.

Once the times have been confirmed, Members who wish to gain access to Lord's on any match day before the scheduled Ground opening time must have an essential appointment with a member of MCC staff or a pre-arranged booking to use the Club's facilities, such as the Tennis and Squash Courts, the Indoor Cricket Centre or the Library.

## COVID-19 – IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Much of the information contained in this booklet is subject to alteration or cancellation at short notice if government regulations and guidelines and operational requirements regarding the current status of the Covid-19 virus change. Members are advised to check the Lords website, [Lords.org](http://Lords.org), regularly for up-to-date information relating to matches and other events and activities at the Ground.

### Match Tickets

In the event of a match being played behind closed doors with no spectators, or if social distancing measures are in place, or if the match date changes, a full refund would be provided automatically to the original purchaser. If the original ticket purchaser lives in an area which is subject to lockdown restrictions, a refund would also be available.

## Tours and Other Events

At the time when this booklet went to print, Tours of the Ground and other events such as Club Dinners were suspended. Full information regarding specific events will be included in email newsletters to Members, but details of events, permitted to go ahead, are included in this booklet.

## THE HUNDRED COMPETITION

For the Hundred Competition there will be a number of special arrangements and the following, which will apply for The Hundred matches only, should be noted:

### Adjustments to Regulations

The Committee has decided to adjust the regulations governing entry to the Pavilion and Members' Friends' Enclosures in three areas:

- There will be no minimum age for entry, in order to encourage Members to introduce children to the game.
- The Pavilion Dress Regulations will be relaxed and entry will be subject to the Dress Regulations more usually in place for the Members' Friends' Enclosures. There will be no requirement to wear a jacket or tie to gain entry to the Pavilion for these matches.
- For those attending in the Members' Friends' Enclosures, the Committee has decided to dispense with Dress Regulations entirely for these matches.

### Tickets

The MCC Ticket Office will not be selling tickets for The Hundred. All ticketing arrangements for The Hundred, including for Pavilion and Members' Friends' Enclosures guest tickets, are being handled centrally by the ECB. To purchase tickets, which are only available online, Members must create an account with ECB's online ticket sales platform for the tournament at [tickets.thehundred.com](http://tickets.thehundred.com)

### Pavilion Admission - Guests

Full Members may purchase up to three Pavilion Admission Tickets for one adult guest (aged 16 or older) and/or up to two children (aged 0-15 years old). Infants aged 0-5 will be admitted free of charge, but will require a ticket as part of this allocation. Pavilion Admission Tickets will be limited in number, and seating within the Pavilion will be unreserved. Pavilion Admission Tickets also admit to the Members' Friends' Enclosures.

Senior and Associate Members will be offered the opportunity to purchase Pavilion Admission Tickets, if any remain, in a second tranche of ticket sales.

## **The Hundred - Tickets for Members' Friends' Enclosures**

Full, Senior and Associate Members may purchase tickets for unreserved seating in the Members' Friends' Enclosures for two adult guests (16 years or older) and/or up to three children, up to a maximum of four Members' Friends' tickets in total. Infants aged 0-5 will be admitted free of charge, but will still require a ticket as part of this allocation.

It must be noted that Children's tickets cannot be upgraded subsequently to Adult tickets.

## **Alcohol-Free Areas**

A number of stands around the Ground have been designated as alcohol-free for The Hundred competition, including the lower tier of the Tavern Stand.

## **ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING**

The Annual General Meeting will take place on Wednesday 12 May 2021. Full details of the 2021 AGM will be sent with the Annual Report.

## **ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTIONS**

Members are reminded that subscriptions are due without notice on 1 January, and those who do not pay by direct debit are asked to ensure prompt payment of the correct amount. Any Member whose subscription has not been paid in full by 1 March will be required to pay a surcharge of 25% of the amount outstanding at that date. Any Member whose subscription remains unpaid on 1 April will lapse.

## **CHANGE OF ADDRESS**

In accordance with MCC Rule 3.18, Members' changes of address are to be notified in writing as they occur. The Club accepts no liability for the consequences of correspondence going astray owing to an incorrect address.

## **MEMBERSHIP PASSES**

This booklet is not a Membership Pass. Passes are issued annually, before the start of the cricket season, and must be signed immediately on receipt. (Unsigned Passes are not valid.) Passes are strictly for Members' personal use and are not transferable. Any breach of this Regulation will be regarded by the Committee as a serious abuse of membership privileges and appropriate action will be taken accordingly.

If a Member's Pass has been lost or destroyed, a Duplicate Pass may be issued on payment of £10, to cover administration costs. The charge is waived, however, if the Pass was lost as a consequence of theft.

A Member who has left their Pass at home, or at a place of work, may be issued with a Temporary Pass, for a single day's use only, on payment of a £5 administrative charge. If the Member is away from home for a number of days, and is unable to retrieve his or her Pass, a complete Duplicate Pass will be issued at a charge of £10.

## **MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES**

A Full or Associate Member who wishes to be placed in any category of membership, other than Inner Town membership, must make a written application to the Chief Executive & Secretary before the commencement

of a calendar year. A Member who fails to make an application for that calendar year shall be treated as an Inner Town Member for that year.

If a Member has previously applied and been accepted into a different category of membership, he or she will remain in that category unless his or her circumstances subsequently change. However, School Staff Members must confirm their continued eligibility for the category on an annual basis.

## CANDIDATES FOR MEMBERSHIP

In accordance with Regulation III.i, a Full or Senior Member may act as Proposer, Seconder or Sponsor for only one Candidate in any calendar year, provided that: (a) if a Playing Member, he or she was elected before 30 September 2019; or (b) if a Non-Playing Member, he or she was elected before 30 September 2016.

### Probationary Cricket Candidates

Candidates with strong cricketing qualifications may apply to be included in the list of Probationary Cricket Candidates. Applicants' names must be entered in the Candidates' Book by 30 September, at the latest, of the year preceding that in which they wish to play, in order to be considered for inclusion on the list for the following season. If accepted for the list they will be asked to play in such number of qualifying matches as the Committee may decide and, if their performances are satisfactory, their election to the Club may be brought forward.

### Candidates for Out-Match Membership

Candidates wishing to apply for Out-Match membership must apply by 30 September at the latest for consideration to be given for the Candidate's inclusion in the following year's list of Probationary Cricket Candidates.

Candidates for Out-Match membership must play cricket to a good club 1st XI standard. If accepted for the list they will be asked to play in such number of qualifying matches as the MCC Committee may decide and, if their performances are satisfactory, their election to the Club may be brought forward.

An Out-Match Candidate may apply, at any time, for his or her name to be transferred on to the list of Candidates for Full membership, subject to the payment of the balance of the Registration Fee applicable to ordinary Candidates at the date of such application. If the Candidate fails to qualify as an Out-Match Member and has not, in the meantime, opted to transfer to the list of Candidates awaiting Full membership, his or her candidature will

be cancelled. Furthermore, if a Candidate for Out-Match membership does not wish his or her name to also be placed on to the ordinary Candidates' waiting list, he or she will be ineligible for Associate membership.

In the event of being elected as an Out-Match Member, the Candidate would be required to play regularly for the Club, or suffer the possibility of having his or her membership withdrawn.

### Endorsement of Candidates

All Candidates must be endorsed by one of the following: a current member of the MCC Committee; a current member of another committee; or a current Area or Assistant Area Representative appointed by the MCC Committee to assist in the organisation of Out-Match cricket. The MCC Committee also reserves the right to appoint additional Endorsers within the British Isles and overseas. Endorsers may propose, second, sponsor or endorse an unlimited number of Candidates in any calendar year. MCC will seek confirmation from the Endorser that he or she is willing to act in this capacity. After the process has been completed, each Candidate will be notified in writing of his or her entry in the Club's Candidates' Book.

## RECIPROCAL ARRANGEMENTS AT OVERSEAS GROUNDS

The Committee has organised reciprocal arrangements with 11 overseas clubs - Melbourne, Sydney, Brisbane, Adelaide, Perth, Lahore Gymkhana, Hong Kong, Singapore, The Cricket Club of India, Western Province Cricket Club and Hagley Oval (Christchurch). In addition, the Committee has approved reciprocal arrangements with the following clubs (which are not cricket clubs): the Pretoria Country Club, the Kelvin Grove Club (Cape Town), the Durban Club and the Rand Club (Johannesburg).

**Because of the Covid-19 situation, certain clubs have suspended any reciprocal arrangements offered in 2021 to members from overseas clubs. Therefore Members intending to visit any of the clubs listed above should contact the MCC Membership Office (020 7616 8660 or [membership@mcc.org.uk](mailto:membership@mcc.org.uk)), prior to travel in order to obtain full and up-to-date information.**

Under normal circumstances, Full Members paying short visits overseas may make use of certain facilities at those clubs on production of the appropriate letter of introduction, which is available from the MCC Membership Office.



## ROVER TICKETS – MAJOR MATCHES

Arrangements for Major Matches in 2021 are subject to alteration which may be at short notice dependent on government regulations and guidelines and operational requirements regarding the current status of the Covid-19 virus. Members are advised to check the Lord's website regularly for up-to-date information.

The following information was the best understanding of the likely position at the time of going to print. If, however, any amendments to these arrangements are necessary, Members will be advised by email, and full information will appear on [lords.org](http://lords.org)

### Match Ticket Refunds

In the event of a match being played subject to crowd-size restrictions, or if the match date changes, a full refund will be provided automatically to the original purchaser. If the original ticket purchaser is subject to government restrictions due to the Covid-19 virus which prevent their attendance at a Major Match then a refund would also be available for that Match.

### Tickets for Reserved Seats in the Members' Friends' Enclosures

Up-to-date information regarding the days for which certain sections of the Members' Friends' Enclosures will be available as reserved seating, may be found on [tickets.lords.org](http://tickets.lords.org)

In order to sit in the reserved section on such days, Members must purchase a ticket for themselves, as well as for their guests with whom they must sit.

### Rover Tickets for Unreserved Seats in the Members' Friends' Enclosures

Members may introduce guests into the unreserved sections on Major Match days by means of Rover Tickets purchased in advance. Members will be admitted to the unreserved sections of the Members' Friends' Enclosures on production of their Membership Passes.

### Senior and Associate Members

In 2021 Senior and Associate Members may purchase Rover Tickets for the following days: England v New Zealand Test Match (Fourth Day) - maximum of 1 ticket; England v Pakistan One-Day International - maximum of 2 tickets; England v India Test Match (Fourth Day) - maximum of 2 tickets; Vitality Blast matches - maximum of 4 tickets.

## Pavilion Admission Tickets for Vitality Blast Matches

For Vitality Blast matches in 2021, Full, Senior and Associate Members will be permitted to introduce into the Pavilion one guest, over the age of 12 years, who must be in possession of a Pavilion Admission Ticket. For each Vitality Blast match there will be a set number of such Pavilion Admission Tickets available, which will also admit to the Members' Friends' Enclosures.

## THE HUNDRED COMPETITION

The MCC Ticket Office will not be selling tickets for The Hundred. All ticketing arrangements for The Hundred, including for Pavilion and Members' Friends' Enclosures guest tickets, are being handled centrally by the ECB. ## MISUSE OF TICKETS

Tickets for the Members' Friends' Enclosures are solely for use by Members, their relatives and personal friends, and the Committee insists that Members ensure that the tickets allocated to themselves and their guests are regarded as strictly non-transferable, in order to safeguard Members' privileges.

In recent years, the Committee has received reports of Rover Tickets being sold by unauthorised ticket agents and by individuals on the pavement outside the Ground. Each case has been investigated separately, and the Committee has taken disciplinary action against Members found responsible.

The Committee is certain that all Members would support such action being taken, since the purchase of tickets for the Members' Friends' Enclosures is considered to be a very important privilege of membership.

## MEMBERS' QUEUES ON MAJOR MATCH DAYS

Arrangements for entry to the Ground, and Members' Queues on major match days in 2021 will be decided in accordance with government regulations and guidelines in effect on the date of the match in question. .

**Arrangements for Members' Queues may be subject to change at short notice to reflect advice from the Metropolitan Police in the best interests of Members' safety and security.**

## DRESS IN THE PAVILION

### Match Days

A formal standard of dress applies in the Pavilion at all times\*. Members, guests and visitors are required to observe it.

**Gentlemen:** tailored jacket or blazer; collared shirt that is tucked into tailored trousers, chinos, corduroys or moleskin trousers; a tie or cravat; and formal shoes with socks which cover the ankle.

**Ladies:** dress, skirt or tailored trousers with a top or blouse, or other clothing that is appropriately formal. Formal shoes, boots or sandals must be worn. *\*For matches in The Hundred Competition, the Pavilion dress regulations will be relaxed and entry will be subject to the dress regulations more usually in place for the Members' Friends' Enclosures on international Major Match days. There will be no requirement to wear a jacket or tie to gain entry to the Pavilion for these matches.*

### Non-Match Days

Smart casual: gentlemen are not required to wear a jacket and tie. On occasions, such as Club Dinners, a more formal standard of dress may apply.

Examples of attire that would result in a refusal of admittance to the Pavilion: jeans; any form of casual shoe and trainers; beach-style flip-flops; and dilapidated or offensive garments of any kind. This list is not exhaustive.

Religious, traditional or national dress, or service uniform, is permitted. Members or guests requiring exceptions to the Dress Regulations for reasons such as medical conditions must have prior authorisation, in writing, from the Pavilion Manager.

**Notwithstanding the dress standards outlined above, MCC reserves the right to refuse entry to any person considered unsuitably attired.**

## DRESS IN THE MEMBERS' FRIENDS' ENCLOSURES

Members and their guests are expected to maintain an acceptable standard of dress while in the Members' Friends' Enclosures. To avoid any embarrassment at the entrance to the enclosures, Members must ensure that their attire, and that of their guests, is appropriate for the area.

The minimum standard of dress\* to enter the Members' Friends' Enclosures is "smart casual" for both sexes. Jackets are not required. On international Major Match days, gentlemen must wear collared shirts (even when a collared sweater or jacket is worn on top) in the stands. On

all other match days, shirts without a collar are acceptable. Shorts and trousers must be tailored, although denim is acceptable.

The following items of clothing are unacceptable:

### Gentlemen

- On international Major Match days, shirts which do not have a collar, including crew-neck shirts and t-shirts (polo-neck shirts are acceptable.) This regulation may be relaxed in respect of those under the age of 16, and on all other match days.
- Singlets
- Torn, ripped or unclean clothing
- Football, running, athletic, cycling, tennis or other shorts worn for playing sport
- Tracksuits
- Garments in military camouflage colours
- Beachwear
- Beach-style flip-flop shoes

### Ladies

- Torn, ripped or unclean clothing
- Football, running, athletic, cycling, tennis or other shorts worn for playing sport
- Tracksuits
- Garments in military camouflage colours
- Bikini tops or tops/dresses showing bare midriff
- Beachwear
- Beach-style flip-flop shoes

Bare feet, bare torsos and anyone wearing dilapidated or offensive garments of any kind will not be permitted under any circumstances. *\*For the Hundred Competition, the Committee has decided to dispense with dress regulations in the Members' Friends' Enclosures entirely.*

**Notwithstanding the dress standards outlined above, MCC reserves the right to refuse entry to any person considered unsuitably attired.**

## DISABLED MEMBERS AND FRIENDS

Arrangements for matches at Lord's in 2021 are subject to alteration if government regulations and guidelines and operational requirements regarding the current status of the Covid-19 virus change. Members are advised to check the Lord's website regularly for up-to-date information.

### Disabled Members - Policy Regarding Tickets for Companions

- If wishing to use the Pavilion, a disabled Member would receive a complimentary ticket for one companion.
- If wishing to use the Members' Friends' Enclosures, a disabled Member would receive a complimentary ticket for one companion.
- If wishing to use a wheelchair-accessible space, a disabled Member would receive a complimentary ticket for one companion.
- If wishing to sit in the Public Stands, a Member would be treated the same as a member of the public.

### Reserved Seats in the Warner Stand Terrace for Disabled Members and Rover Ticket Holders

A small section is reserved in the Warner Stand Terrace on major match days for disabled Members and Rover Ticket holders who are not wheelchair users. Space is limited, and Members wishing to use the area are asked to apply by e-mail ([clubfacilities@mcc.org.uk](mailto:clubfacilities@mcc.org.uk)), to the Club Facilities Department advising of the number of people in their party, and giving a brief explanation of the reason for the request, once the appropriate Rover Tickets have been purchased. **Because of the increasing number of applications for reserved seats in this area, the Committee has agreed that no more than four seats per Member may be requested on any day.**

### Wheelchair-Accessible Spaces for Disabled Members and Guests

Wheelchair-accessible spaces are available for wheelchair-using Members and guests at the front and the rear of the Warner Stand Terrace. Wheelchair-accessible spaces are also available in the public stands at the front of the Mound Stand Lower Tier; at the rear of the Grand Stand Lower Tier; at the front and rear of the Compton Stand Lower Tier and at the front and rear of the Edrich Stand Lower Tier. Tickets for these areas are allocated on a first-come, first-served basis, and application should be made by telephoning the Ticket Office (020 7432 1010) or by emailing [disabilitytickets@mcc.org.uk](mailto:disabilitytickets@mcc.org.uk)

### Wheelchair-Accessible Spaces for Disabled Members in the Pavilion

In addition, live ball-by-ball commentary for blind or partially-sighted Members and visitors will be provided by the Club's volunteer commentators for a variety of other matches that take place at Lord's throughout the season. ## SPECIAL FACILITIES FOR ELDERLY MEMBERS RESERVED SEATS ON THE PAVILION CONCOURSE

Arrangements for Major Matches at Lord's in 2021 are subject to alteration if government regulations and guidelines and operational requirements regarding the current status of the Covid-19 virus change. Members are advised to check the Lord's website regularly for up-to-date information.

**Members who are over 75 years of age, and were elected more than 30 years ago, are entitled to apply for a reserved seat on the concourse in front of the Pavilion on Major Match days in 2021.**

**Applications for reserved seats must be made in writing to the Club Facilities Department, or by e-mail to [clubfacilities@mcc.org.uk](mailto:clubfacilities@mcc.org.uk)** Such applications have been accepted since October 2020, and will continue to be dealt with on a first-come-first-served basis so long as seats remain available. The number of seats available on any day is limited to 200. It is inevitable that the scheme will continue to be oversubscribed in respect of the more popular major match days, and early application is advised.

Reserved seats, if unoccupied, will be released 30 minutes after the scheduled start of play.

## NO-SMOKING AREAS AT LORD'S

Smoking is prohibited inside all buildings in Lord's Ground. It is also not permitted on the concourse, roof terrace and balconies of the Pavilion; on any staircases; in any stands and enclosures or on the balconies of boxes. The use of electronic cigarettes is prohibited in all stands and enclosures.

Stewards are able to provide information on the nearest designated area where smoking is permitted.

## PRIVATE ENTERTAINMENT FACILITIES

Arrangements for matches at Lord's in 2021 are subject to alteration if government regulations and guidelines and operational requirements regarding the current status of the Covid-19 virus change. Members are advised to check the Lord's website regularly for up-to-date information.

### (a) Private Suites

Private Suites may be hired for any match day at Lord's. The Suites accommodate a maximum of eighteen people for a buffet-style lunch, and benefit from fixed seating on the viewing balcony.

For major matches, a limited number of Suites are reserved for use by the President, Club Chairman or Treasurer, Chief Executive & Secretary, sponsors of the match concerned, ICC, the ECB, and domestic finalists. Available facilities are allocated by ballot to Members and thereafter to members of the public. Members of the MCC Committee are entitled to priority in respect of one Suite for each major match day (or, in respect of the Fourth and Fifth Days of the Test Matches, pair of days) each season. Not more than two Suites are allocated to the Committee on any one day.

Application for inclusion in the ballot must have been received by MCC on the appropriate form no later than stated on each ballot form. All applicants will be notified of the outcome of the ballot.

Applications for the hire of Private Suites for matches other than those covered by the ballot may be made in writing at any time. Full details of the entertainment facilities available may be obtained from the Club's Hospitality Department (020 7616 8598).

## CATERING

The following information relating to Restaurants and Bars at Lord's is subject to alteration which may be at short notice dependent on government regulations and guidelines and operational requirements regarding the current status of the Covid-19 virus. Members are advised to check the Lord's website regularly for up-to-date information.

### (a) Restaurants

The MCC Members' online restaurant ballot, for all International Major Matches in the 2021 season, has been postponed, and at the time of this booklet going to print the date had not been confirmed. Further information will appear on the Lord's website as soon as it is available. Once the ballot has taken place, Members will receive an email to confirm whether or not their application has been successful. Any remaining restaurant places will then go on sale and bookings may be made online by visiting the Lord's website or by telephoning the Restaurant Booking Line, 020 7616 8563.

Because of the rapidly-changing Covid-19 situation, the opening hours of all bars in the Pavilion and around the Ground will be decided on a match-by-match basis, in line with government guidelines, to ensure the safety of everyone.

#### **(i) Pelham's**

Pelham's is located at the top of the Warner Stand. On all International Major Match days, Pelham's is available to Full Members and their guests for whom they have purchased Rover Tickets. Associate and Senior Members may book, with guests, but only for the days on which they are entitled to purchase Rover Tickets. On Major Match days, the Members' Lounge will be open to Members of MCC only and will serve bacon and sausage rolls and beef baps.

#### **(c) Old Library**

On Major Match days, breakfast baps, hot carved-meat baps with salad, and afternoon tea will be served in the Old Library.

#### **(d) Pavilion Bars**

Drinking is allowed only in the bars and designated areas in front of the Pavilion. Neither food nor drink may be taken from the bars to other parts of the Pavilion. Although the Pavilion bars are open all day, those using the bars should not take drinks outside, in the view of the general public, when the public bars are closed. If this request is not observed, it may be necessary to restrict the opening hours of Pavilion bars.

##### **(i) The Long Room Bar**

The Long Room Bar is open on all match days, and will close half an hour after the close of play. However, in the event of an abandonment of play, it will close half an hour after the announcement of such abandonment, or half an hour after the end of the scheduled tea interval, whichever is the later.

##### **(ii) The Bowlers' Bar**

On all match days\*, the Bowlers' Bar will remain open until 90 minutes after the close of play or until 20.00, whichever is the earliest. The Ground will close two hours after the close of play, or at 20.30, whichever is the earliest. All Members and spectators must have left the Ground by that time.

\*For evening Vitality Blast matches, the Bowlers' Bar will close at 22.30. For The Hundred Competition matches, arrangements will be communicated to Members in due course.

**On non-match days, the bar will be open and staffed only when an event is taking place in the Pavilion. Otherwise, it will operate as an honesty bar. Enquiries regarding the opening times of the Bowlers' Bar on non-match days may be directed to the Pavilion Stewards on 020 7616 8680.**

In the winter months, from 1 October to 31 March, Members and their guests may wear informal clothing, subject to the dress regulations on page 13. Tennis and Squash players may use the bar during this period if they wear long trousers or tracksuit bottoms as part of their playing clothes. During other months, Pavilion Dress Regulations will apply.

### (iii) Members' Bar

The Members' Bar is for Members of MCC and Middlesex and their guests or members of visiting counties only. ### (f) Indoor Cricket Centre Bar

### (g) Public Bars

On major match days\* the Public Bars are usually open between 10.45 and 18.00. It may be necessary at other times, according to circumstances, to restrict the opening hours of licensed bars.

\*For evening Vitality Blast matches, public bars will open from gate opening time until 20.45.

The MCC Museum, behind the Pavilion, houses a unique collection of historical and contemporary exhibits including the Ashes Urn. During the cricket season, it is open until 17.00 on all match days apart from Vitality Blast and Hundred matches when it is open until the end of the interval between innings, and until approximately 30 minutes prior to the close of play on all other Major Match days. In the event of the day's play being abandoned, or the match ending early, the Museum will close half an hour after the abandonment of play or after the end of the game. On Major Match days the Library will be open from gate opening time until 30 minutes after close of play, with the exception of Vitality Blast and Hundred matches when it will remain open until the end of the interval between innings. Members are welcome to visit the Library during opening hours, but if they wish to consult any specific material they are requested to make an appointment (020 7616 8559). The Library and Archive catalogues can be viewed online via lords.org. Archival material may be consulted in the Library by appointment.

## LORD'S TOUR

Led by an experienced Tour Guide, a Standard Public Tour of Lord's visits the Pavilion (including the Long Room and Dressing Rooms), J.P. Morgan Media Centre, and the MCC Museum.

Members may attend a Standard Public Tour, free of charge, on production of their Membership Pass. As the size of Standard Public Tour groups is capped, Members are advised to book in advance to ensure that they can be accommodated.

Standard Public Tours are scheduled to take place at the following times:

January to March:	10.00, 11.00, 12.00, and 14.00 (13.00 on selected dates)
April to October:	10.00, 11.00, 12.00, 13.00, 14.00, 15.00, 16.00, and 17.00
November to December:	10.00, 11.00, 12.00, and 14.00. (13.00 on selected dates)

There are no Standard Public Tours on Major Match days, the days set aside for the preparation of the Ground for Major Matches, large event days and on days when the Ground is closed over Christmas. Standard Public Tour availability is limited on other match days.

## MOBILE DEVICES (INCLUDING TELEPHONES)

The attention of Members is drawn to Ground Regulation I.3a. (please refer to page 32), which governs the use of mobile devices, including telephones, in the Pavilion and other parts of the Ground.

Stewards have been instructed to ensure this Regulation is strictly enforced, and the co-operation of Members and their guests would be appreciated.

## AUTOGRAPHS

In accordance with Regulation III.h, the seeking of players' autographs in the Pavilion and at Club Dinners is forbidden. Members are asked to desist from entering the Ground on major match preparation days in order to seek autographs or to take photographs of cricketers whilst they are practising.

## REGULATIONS OF MCC

(By order of the MCC Committee in accordance with MCC Rule 13.2.)

### I. GROUND REGULATIONS

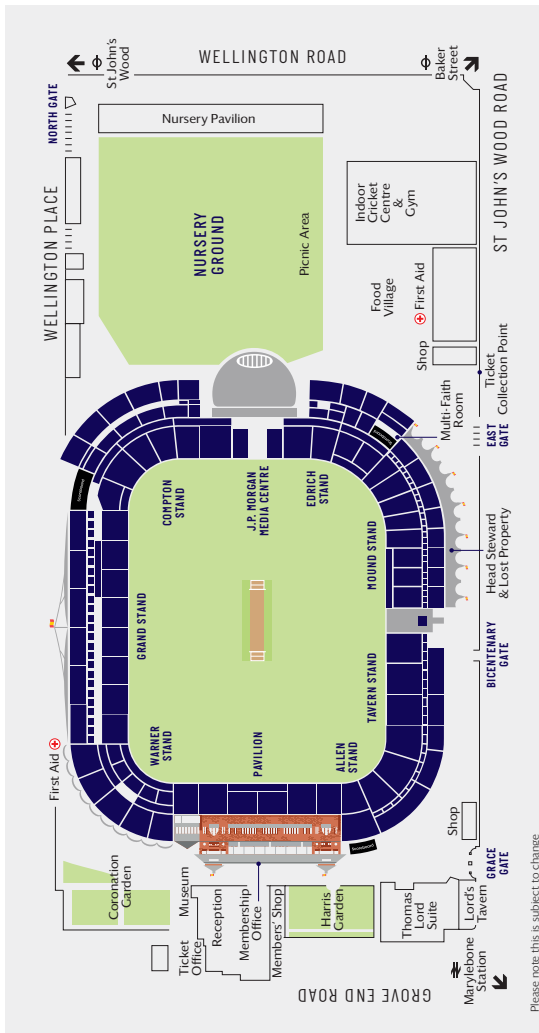
Arrangements for match days in 2021 are subject to alteration which may be at short notice dependent on government regulations and guidelines and operational requirements regarding the current status of the Covid-19 virus. Members are advised to check the Lord's website regularly for up-to-date information.

#### 1. Admission Requirements

- Marylebone Cricket Club reserves the right of admission to Lord's Ground, all persons entering which are liable to be searched.
- All persons entering Lord's Ground are admitted subject to the Regulations of MCC who reserve the right to remove from Lord's Ground any person who refuses to comply with or breaches them, or who refuses to follow the instruction of any person acting for or on behalf of the Club or a member of the police force.
- Children under the age of 14 years will not be admitted to the Ground unless accompanied by an adult.

#### 2. Prohibited and Restricted Behaviour and Items

- Any person who makes abusive or threatening comments, whether racially or sexually motivated or otherwise, or who, in any way, acts in an abusive or threatening manner, or whose presence (in the Club's reasonable opinion) is a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to others, may be subject to ejection from the Ground and any such other action as may be determined by the Club.
- A person wearing a kirpan may be admitted to Lord's Ground so long as such kirpan is no more than six inches in length (blade and handle), in a sheath and worn under a shirt or a similar garment; and is being carried as part of the person's religious observation.
- No person may bring an animal (other than a guide dog) into Lord's Ground unless written authority is obtained in advance from the Chief Executive & Secretary.
- Small quantities of alcohol may be brought into Lord's Ground, but is limited to the equivalent of
  - one bottle of wine or Champagne (max. 750ml), or
  - two cans/bottles of beer/cider (max. 500ml each), or
  - two cans of premixed aperitifs (max. 330ml each)per spectator. Bottles of spirits or fortified wines will not be allowed into the

- Ground. Amounts of alcohol in excess of these limits and any alcohol in excess of 18% ABV will be confiscated. Under no circumstances will any spectator be re-admitted to Lord's Ground at any time during the day if in possession of any alcohol. MCC reserves the right to confiscate any quantity of alcohol from any spectator, leaving or entering Lord's Ground.
- e. Flags and banners (except on Vitality Blast and The Hundred match days), musical instruments, klaxons, rattles, fireworks, firearms, weapons, any camera tripods, monopods, lenses with a total focal length of greater than 200mm or commercial digital video equipment, and other articles which, in the Club's reasonable opinion, may be dangerous, offensive, hazardous and/or constitute an annoyance to spectators are also prohibited inside Lord's Ground. The wearing of fancy dress costumes and oversized hats inside Lord's Ground is prohibited.
  - f. A spectator who has left Lord's Ground before 16.00 will be re-admitted on the same day without further payment of the admission charge, but only if he or she produces a ticket valid for re-admission or, if issued, a return pass together with the retained portion of a valid admission ticket.
  - g. On no occasion is play guaranteed and on no occasion will any money, paid for the admission of any person to Lord's Ground, be returned other than in respect of days for which a ticket-refund scheme applies, the details of such scheme being printed on the reverse of all tickets.
  - h. All unauthorised persons are prohibited from entering the playing area at all times.
  - i. All persons while at Lord's Ground are prohibited from:
    - (i) throwing any object or projectile without lawful authority or excuse;
    - (ii) climbing on any building, wall, other structure or tree;
    - (iii) obstructing any staircase, gangway, passageway or alleyway;
    - (iv) defacing or obscuring any notice or advertisement on display; or
    - (v) causing damage to, or otherwise interfering with, any item of equipment, furniture, fitting or fixture.
  - j. Smoking is prohibited inside the Pavilion and all other buildings in Lord's Ground, whether permanent or temporary structures, in all shops, offices and workshops, in all dressing rooms, washrooms and lavatories, in all boxes and marquees, and on all staircases. On the concourse, roof terrace and balconies of the Pavilion, in all stands and enclosures, and on the balconies of boxes, smoking is not permitted. In other areas of Lord's Ground, smoking is permitted unless no-smoking signs are exhibited or an area where smoking is prohibited is otherwise marked. The use of electronic cigarettes is prohibited in all stands and enclosures.

- k. No sponsorship, promotional or marketing materials may be brought into, used or displayed by any person within Lord's Ground, save with the prior authorisation, in writing, of the Chief Executive & Secretary.
- l. No person may conduct public surveys or opinion polls, solicit money, donations or subscriptions within Lord's Ground, save with the prior authorisation, in writing, of the Chief Executive & Secretary.
- m. No person inside Lord's Ground may offer articles for sale, or offer the provision of services, or distribute leaflets or any other form of printed material, save with the prior authorisation, in writing, of the Chief Executive & Secretary. Unauthorised goods offered for sale within Lord's Ground will be confiscated.

### **3. Media, Use of Mobile Devices and Recordings**

- a. Mobile Devices (including, but not restricted to, telephones, radios, cameras, music players, video recorders and players, watches, computers and other electrical or electronic devices or any other such device now known or hereafter invented) may be used subject to the following restrictions applying to their use, and for the purpose of this Regulation 3(a) Lord's Ground is divided into three Areas, as follows:
  - Area A:** the Pavilion and the Warner Stand Bars and Restaurant. Within this Area, at all times, Mobile Devices must not be allowed to ring or make any other audible sound, and no person may speak into a Mobile Device.
  - Area B:** the Pavilion concourse and balconies, all other enclosures and stands, and all other seating areas from which the playing area can be viewed, including balconies of boxes. Within this Area once the umpires have appeared on the playing area for the purpose of starting or restarting play and until the umpires have left the playing area, Mobile Devices must not be allowed to ring or make any other audible sound, and no person may speak into a Mobile Device. Within this Area at other times, Mobile Devices may be allowed to ring and it is permitted to speak into them.
  - Area C:** all other parts of Lord's Ground. Within this Area, at all times, Mobile Devices may be allowed to ring and it is permitted to speak into them.
- b. The taking of photographs, and all types of filming in the Pavilion are prohibited save with the prior authorisation, in writing, of the Chief Executive & Secretary.
- c. It is prohibited for any photograph, video recording, film, sketch, painting or other image produced within Lord's Ground to be used for any commercial purpose, including (without limitation) for any commercial reproduction and distribution, whether as a freestanding image or recording or by application or incorporation of the same to or in any goods or use in connection with

- the provision of any services. The making of any such image for any of the commercial purposes referred to in this Regulation 3(c) is likewise prohibited save with the prior authorisation, in writing, of the Chief Executive & Secretary.
- d. With the exception of those persons in receipt of an official accreditation issued by the England and Wales Cricket Board (the “ECB”), all visitors to Lord’s Ground acknowledge that MCC is the sole owner of the copyright and any other intellectual property rights of any nature whatsoever in and to any recordings of sound made or images taken at Lord’s Ground, including future rights to such recordings or to any works derived from such recordings that is not a video or sound recording or photograph taken for only private, non-commercial and non-promotional purposes. All visitors unconditionally and irrevocably assign to MCC all rights, including copyright and other intellectual property rights, in any recordings of sound made or images taken at Lord’s Ground that is not a video or sound recording or photograph taken for only private, non-commercial and non-promotional purposes.
- e. All visitors to Lord’s Ground consent to (i) the recording of their image, likeness and/or voice by any means (including but not limited to video, audio and visual recordings by television cameras and photographers) (together “Images”) and (ii) the use of the Images at Lord’s Ground, including display on vision screens throughout any match and (iii) the commercial exploitation, throughout the world, of the Images by any means by MCC, the ECB and its commercial partners (including without limitation the International Cricket Council and any official sponsor, official supplier, broadcaster or licensee), all without compensation of any kind.
- f. Under no circumstances may any person at Lord’s Ground use a mobile telephone, computer or any other kind of communication device (now known or hereafter invented) to communicate, transfer or otherwise transmit any audio, visual or audio-visual data, information, commentary, footage or other material in relation to a cricket match (or any aspect thereof) taking place at Lord’s Ground for any kind of improper betting or any other corrupt, fraudulent or unlawful purpose.
- g. Any person at Lord’s Ground who is reasonably suspected by MCC (or its appointed nominees, including but not limited for such purposes to the anti-corruption officials and any other representatives of the ECB) of acting in breach of Regulation 3(f) during any cricket match unconditionally acknowledges, accepts and agrees that
- (i) such person must, upon request by MCC (or its appointed nominees), provide his or her name and address and an explanation for his or her suspicious conduct (including full details of the nature of his or her

- suspicious communications), and
  - (ii) such person may be photographed and, or, filmed by MCC (or its appointed nominees), and
  - (iii) any such names, addresses, photographs and films collected by MCC (or its appointed nominees) pursuant to this Regulation may be shared between each of the ECB and the first-class county cricket clubs and relevant official cricket authorities and the police and any relevant crime-prevention authorities, for the purposes of any criminal investigations or proceedings, and, or, in connection with any investigation into a potential breach of domestic or international cricket anticorruption rules and, or, to enable MCC, the ECB and the first-class county cricket clubs to give reciprocal effect to any ban on entry which is subsequently imposed by MCC pursuant to this Regulation. Personal data collected under this provision will be processed in accordance with the Data Protection Act 2018 (the “Act”). A person providing his or her personal data may have rights in respect of such data under the Act and any questions regarding the handling of personal data should be addressed to MCC which is the data controller for the purposes of the Act.
- h. Any person reasonably suspected of being in breach of Regulation 3(g) accepts that he or she may be immediately removed from Lord’s Ground (without any financial or other compensation) and prohibited from entering Lord’s Ground and any other cricket ground under the control of MCC, the ECB or any first-class county cricket club for life or such other period of time as the MCC Committee deems appropriate in respect of Lord’s Ground and as the ECB or the relevant ground authority deems appropriate in respect of any other ground, in all cases in the sole and absolute discretion of the MCC Committee, the ECB or the relevant ground authority, as the case may be.
- i. No other betting (unless specifically authorised by the MCC Committee), unnecessary noise or confusion of any kind is permitted in any part of Lord’s Ground.

#### **4. Risks, Waiver and Indemnity**

- a. All visitors to Lord’s Ground shall be responsible for ensuring their own safety from risks involved in attending a cricket match or being admitted to a large cricket ground and agree that they shall be solely responsible for any injuries sustained to or losses incurred by them, whether financial or otherwise, and that MCC shall be free of liability from any form of compensation and indemnified in respect of any claim made against it, save for where the law provides otherwise.

## 5. General

- a. Private Suites and other entertainment facilities are not transferable and are subject to conditions laid down by the MCC Committee.
- b. The availability of car parking within Lord's Ground will be decided by the MCC Committee in accordance with the importance of any match.
- c. Any property (including but not limited to any motor car or other vehicle) left anywhere on the premises of MCC remains at the entire risk of the owner of the property or person leaving the same, and the Club accepts no liability for the theft or other loss of or damage to such property.
- d. Closed-circuit television cameras are in use around and in Lord's Ground and MCC may itself use, or pass to the police or any other relevant authority, any recordings for use in any proceedings.

## II. MATCH AND PRACTICE REGULATIONS

- a. The MCC Committee shall decide, subject to the rules and regulations of the England and Wales Cricket Board, the admission charges for matches at Lord's.
- b. The hours of play and conduct of all matches at Lord's shall be in accordance with the Playing Conditions agreed for each particular match. The umpires shall report any breach to the Chief Executive & Secretary.
- c. Five minutes before the start of each session of play a bell shall be rung and the umpires shall go to the wickets.
- d. No person who is not a Full, Associate, Senior or Out-Match Member of MCC may use the outdoor practice nets unless he has been authorised by the Chief Executive & Secretary to do so, or is playing in a match at Lord's.
- e. At all times, other than occasions decided by the MCC Committee, appropriate white cricket clothing (or official team uniform) shall be worn for practice.
- f. No net practice shall be allowed on major match days at Lord's or on any other day decided by the Chief Executive & Secretary, other than for those players who are specifically involved in the match in progress on such days.

## III. MEMBERSHIP REGULATIONS

All information relating to matches and other events at Lord's, contained in the Membership Regulations is subject to alteration dependent on government regulations and guidelines.

- a. Membership Passes are not transferable. Rover Tickets and Pavilion admission tickets purchased for Members' guests are for the use of only one guest for the duration of the relevant match and are not transferable. Any

breach of this Regulation will be considered by the Disciplinary Panel and may lead to expulsion from the Club.

- b. A Full or Associate Member who wishes to be placed in any category of membership, other than Inner Town Membership, must make a written application to the Chief Executive & Secretary before the commencement of a calendar year, the application to be in respect of such calendar year and may, with the exception of applications for the category of School Staff membership, be for subsequent calendar years also. A Member who fails to make such an application in respect of a calendar year shall be treated as an Inner Town Member for that calendar year.
- c. On Middlesex CCC match days, the Allen Stand Lower Tier will be reserved for Middlesex CCC members and their guests and MCC Members and their guests.
- d. For the Test Matches, the Royal London One-Day International, the Vitality Blast matches and other matches specified by the MCC Committee from time to time, Members may introduce guests into the Members' Friends' Enclosures only by means of Rover Tickets, which are for use solely by the friends and relatives of Members.

For the Vitality Blast matches, Members may introduce into the Pavilion one guest over the age of 12 years, who must be in possession of a Pavilion Admission Ticket.

For The Hundred Competition, Full Members may purchase up to three Pavilion Admission Tickets for one adult guest (aged 16 or older) and/or up to two children (aged 0-15 years). Full, Senior and Associate Members may purchase tickets for unreserved seating in the Members' Friends' Enclosures for two adult guests (16 years or older) and/or up to three children, up to a maximum of four Members' Friends' tickets in total. Children's tickets cannot be upgraded subsequently to Adult tickets.

- e. For matches other than those specified in Regulation III.d., a Full Member may introduce guests as follows:
  - (1) **To the Ground**, free of charge at the Members' Gate, his or her spouse and sons and daughters under fourteen years of age, EXCEPT for touring team matches and Royal London One-Day Cup matches.
  - (2) **To the Members' Friends' Enclosures**, after payment of the ground admission charge, where applicable, up to four guests, in addition to any guests introduced under (3) below.
  - (3) **To the Pavilion**, after payment of the ground admission charge, one guest; children under 12 years of age may not be so introduced. *"For matches in The Hundred Competition only, there will be no minimum age for entry into the Pavilion.*

Introductions under (3) must be made by the Member in person, but under (1) and (2) may be either personal or by letter presented by the guest(s). Such letter must state the name(s) of the guest(s) and the date on which the privilege is required, and be signed by the Member concerned. The MCC Committee reserves the right to restrict admission to the Pavilion on any occasion at its discretion.

- f. Whilst the Club very much hopes to maintain the past arrangements for Members in terms of gate opening times for matches played at Lord's in 2021, it is not possible at the time of publication of this booklet to confirm this information.

Further details of these times will be confirmed in future communications issued by the Club.

Once the times have been confirmed, Members who wish to gain access to Lord's on any match day before the scheduled Ground opening time must have an essential appointment with a member of MCC staff or a pre-arranged booking to use the Club's facilities, such as the Tennis and Squash Courts, the Indoor Cricket Centre or the Library.

For Major Matches, Full Members will be admitted to:

- (1) the Pavilion;
- (2) the Warner Stand;
- (3) the Allen Stand Upper Tier, which is regarded as an extension of the Pavilion;
- (4) the Allen Stand Lower Tier;
- (5) the Tavern Stand.

Holders of Rover Tickets will be admitted to the Warner Stand, Tavern Stand or Allen Stand (Lower Tier).

In order to prevent overcrowding in individual stands, each Full Member and Rover Ticket holder may, on entry to a stand, be issued with a pass which must be presented, together with the Membership Pass or Rover Ticket, on any subsequent re-entry during the day.

Members may reserve seats in the Members' Friends' Enclosures prior to play; the precise number of seats (generally no more than four) will be determined on a match-by-match basis and advised to Members in pre-match communications. The Club accepts no responsibility for articles used for the purpose of seat reservation.

Seats may also be reserved from 15 minutes before until 30 minutes after the luncheon interval, and during other brief absences not exceeding 10 minutes.

It is not practical to have stewards on hand in all areas throughout the Members'

Friends' Enclosures, so Members are asked to observe the spirit of fair play.

Members and their guests are expected to maintain an acceptable standard of dress while in the Members' Friends' Enclosures. To avoid any embarrassment at the entrance to the enclosures, Members must ensure that their attire, and that of their guests, is appropriate for the area.

The minimum standard of dress\* to enter the Members' Friends' Enclosures is "smart casual" for both sexes. Jackets are not required. On international Major Match days, gentlemen must wear collared shirts (even when a collared sweater or jacket is worn on top) in the stands. On all other match days, shirts without a collar are acceptable.

The following items of clothing are unacceptable:

#### **Gentlemen**

- On international Major Match days, shirts including crew-neck shirts and t-shirts (polo-neck shirts are acceptable). This regulation may be relaxed in respect of those under sixteen years old and on all other match days.
- Singlets
- Torn, ripped or unclean clothing
- Football, running, athletic, cycling, tennis or other shorts worn for playing sport
- Tracksuits
- Garments in military camouflage colours
- Beachwear
- Beach-style flip-flop shoes

#### **Ladies**

- Torn, ripped or unclean clothing
- Football, running, athletic, cycling, tennis or other shorts worn for playing sport
- Tracksuits
- Garments in military camouflage colours
- Bikini tops or tops/dresses showing bare midriff
- Beachwear
- Beach-style flip-flop shoes

Bare feet, bare torsos and anyone wearing dilapidated or offensive garments of any kind will not be permitted under any circumstances.

*\*For The Hundred Competition, the Committee has decided to dispense with dress regulations in the Members' Friends' Enclosures entirely.*

**Notwithstanding the dress standards outlined above, MCC reserves the right to refuse entry to any person considered unsuitably attired.**

g. The following dress regulations will apply in the Pavilion:

#### Match Days

A formal standard of dress applies in the Pavilion at all times\*. Members, guests and visitors are required to observe it.

**Gentlemen:** tailored jacket or blazer; collared shirt that is tucked into tailored trousers, chinos, corduroys or moleskin trousers; a tie or cravat; and formal shoes with socks which cover the ankle.

**Ladies:** dress, skirt or tailored trousers with a top or blouse, or other clothing that is appropriately formal. Formal shoes, boots or sandals must be worn.

*\*For matches in The Hundred Competition, the Pavilion dress regulations will be relaxed and entry will be subject to the dress regulations more usually in place for the Members' Friends' Enclosures on international Major Match days. There will be no requirement to wear a jacket or tie to gain entry to the Pavilion for these matches.*

#### Non-Match Days

Smart casual: as above; however, gentlemen are not required to wear a jacket and tie. On occasions, such as Club Dinners, a more formal standard of dress may apply.

Examples of attire that would result in a refusal of admittance to the Pavilion: jeans; any form of casual shoe and trainers; beach-style flip-flops; and dilapidated or offensive garments of any kind. This list is not exhaustive.

Religious, traditional or national dress, or service uniform, is permitted. Members or guests requiring exceptions to the Dress Regulations for reasons such as medical conditions must have prior authorisation, in writing, from the Pavilion Manager.

**Notwithstanding the dress standards outlined above, MCC reserves the right to refuse entry to any person considered unsuitably attired.**

- h. Seeking to interrupt or delay cricketers or match officials while entering or leaving the field of play or whilst passing through the Pavilion or concourse at any time is forbidden;
- (1) the seeking of players' autographs or asking for photographs in the Pavilion or concourse and at Club Dinners is forbidden; and
  - (2) Members are asked to desist from entering the Ground on Major Match preparation days in order to seek autographs or to take photographs of cricketers whilst they are practising.
- i. A Full or Senior Member may in any calendar year propose, second or sponsor **only one Candidate for membership** subject to conditions laid down by the MCC Committee. Please note that priority to represent the Club

in Golf Matches and Golf Tours will be given to Full Members.

j. Associate membership is offered in turn to those on the waiting list as vacancies arise and on the following conditions:

- (1) Associate membership is optional. Candidates retain their position in the waiting list for Full membership, irrespective of whether they accept Associate membership.
- (2) Associate Members are required to accept Full membership in due course, when their names are reached. If they do not do so, they cease to be Associate Members and their candidature lapses.
- (3) Associate Members are eligible for all subscription categories available to Full Members, and on the same conditions, but at lower annual rates, fixed from time to time by the MCC Committee.
- (4) **Associate Members are not entitled:**
  - To propose, second, sponsor or support Candidates for membership.
  - To attend or vote at Annual or Special General Meetings.
  - To make any claim on the financial assets of the Club.

(5) **Associate Members have the following privileges:**

To wear the Club colours.

To be admitted to the Ground, Pavilion and Members' Friends' Enclosures (Allen Stand, Tavern Stand and Warner Stand) on production of an Associate membership pass, for all matches **except the First, Second and Third Days of the England v New Zealand Test Match, and the First, Second and Third Days of the England v India Test Match** and other matches specified from time to time by the MCC Committee.

To apply in advance for a specified maximum number of Rover Tickets for their personal guests for each of the following days:

- England v New Zealand Test Match (Fourth Day) - 1 Rover Ticket
- England v Pakistan One-Day International - 2 Rover Tickets
- England v India Test Match (Fourth Day) - 2 Rover Tickets
- Vitality Blast Matches - 4 Rover Tickets

For the Vitality Blast matches in 2021, Associate Members will be permitted to introduce into the Pavilion one guest over the age of 12 years, who must be in possession of a Pavilion Admission Ticket.

For The Hundred Competition, Associate Members may purchase tickets for unreserved seating in the Members' Friends' Enclosures for two adult guests (16 years or older) and/or up to three children, up to a maximum of four Members' Friends' tickets in total. Associate Members will be offered the opportunity to purchase Pavilion Admission Tickets, if any remain, in a second tranche of ticket sales after they have been offered to Full Members.

To introduce guests into the Pavilion **on non-major match days**, after payment of the ground admission charge, as set out in Special Regulations determined by the MCC Committee on an annual basis.

To introduce a further two guests into the Members' Friends' Enclosures **on non-major match days**, after payment of the ground admission charge, where applicable.

On the same basis as Full Members, to use the practice nets and squash courts, to participate in Golf Days and events organised by the Bridge, Chess and Backgammon societies, and to enter their sons and daughters for Easter Coaching Classes.

To book the Tennis Court no more than one week in advance.

To use the Members' Dining facilities on days when they have free admission to the Ground.

To apply for private entertainment facilities for matches other than those subject to ballots.

To purchase, in advance of the public, tickets in the public stands for the major matches at Lord's (other than the Fifth Days of the Test Matches, for which there is no advance booking), subject to availability.

k. The list of Senior Members, which closed at the end of 2005, reopened in 2019. The conditions relating to Senior Members are as follows:

**(1) Senior Members are not entitled:**

To attend the First, Second and Third Days of the England v New Zealand Test Match, and the First, Second and Third Days of the England v India Test Match and other matches specified by the Committee in unforeseen circumstances, unless in possession of a ticket or pass admitting to the Ground.

To be eligible for any other category or status of membership with the exception of Life membership which is offered on completion of 60 years of membership.

**(2) Senior Members have the following privileges:**

To wear the Club colours.

To be admitted to the Ground, Pavilion and Members' Friends' Enclosures (Allen Stand, Tavern Stand and Warner Stand) on production of a Senior membership pass, for all matches **except the First, Second and Third Days of the England v New Zealand Test Match, and the First, Second and Third Days of the England v India Test Match** and other matches specified from time to time by the MCC Committee.

To apply in advance for a specified maximum number of Rover Tickets for

their personal guests for each of the following days:

- England v New Zealand Test Match (Fourth Day) - 1 Rover Ticket
- England v Pakistan One-Day International - 2 Rover Tickets
- England v India Test Match (Fourth Day) - 2 Rover Tickets
- Vitality Blast Matches - 4 Rover Tickets

For the Vitality Blast matches in 2021, Senior Members will be permitted to introduce into the Pavilion one guest over the age of 12 years, who must be in possession of a Pavilion Admission Ticket.

For The Hundred Competition, Senior Members may purchase tickets for unreserved seating in the Members' Friends' Enclosures for two adult guests (16 years or older) and/or up to three children, up to a maximum of four Members' Friends' tickets in total. Senior Members will be offered the opportunity to purchase Pavilion Admission Tickets, if any remain, in a second tranche of ticket sales after they have been offered to Full Members.

To introduce guests into the Pavilion **on non-major match days**, after payment of the ground admission charge, as set out in Special Regulations determined by the MCC Committee on an annual basis.

To introduce a further two guests into the Members' Friends' Enclosures **on non-major match days**, after payment of the ground admission charge, where applicable.

On the same basis as Full Members, to use the practice nets, tennis and squash courts, to participate in Golf Days and events organised by the Bridge, Chess and Backgammon societies, and to enter their sons and daughters for Easter Coaching Classes.

To use the Members' Dining facilities on days when they have free admission to the Ground.

To apply for private entertainment facilities for matches other than those subject to ballots.

- l. Smoking in the Pavilion or Members' Friends' Enclosures is forbidden.
- m. Members, their guests and other visitors are not permitted to ring the five-minute bell, situated on the Bowlers' Bar balcony, unless asked to do so by the Chief Executive & Secretary.



#### **IV. SALE AND SUPPLY OF ALCOHOL**

- a. The following persons (provided they are over 18 years), at the discretion of the MCC Committee, may make use of the licensed facilities in the bars and dining rooms in the Pavilion:
  - (1) Members of the Marylebone Cricket Club.
  - (2) Guests introduced into the Pavilion officially or by Members of the Marylebone Cricket Club.
  - (3) Players and officials of teams playing at Lord's.
  - (4) Members of Middlesex County Cricket Club on Middlesex match days; and members of other clubs whose teams are playing at Lord's.
  - (5) Guests of Middlesex County Cricket Club members introduced officially by such members on Middlesex match days.
  - (6) When applicable, staff of the Marylebone Cricket Club and Middlesex County Cricket Club.
- b. The Chief Executive & Secretary shall be, or shall nominate a person to be, the Club's designated premises supervisor in connection with the sale and supply of alcohol under the Club's premises licences, subject always to the Chief Executive & Secretary, or his nominee, being a personal licence-holder.

#### **V. DISCIPLINARY REGULATIONS**

## SUMMARY OF FULL MEMBERS' RIGHTS AND PRIVILEGES

### (a) Rights

1. To be admitted upon production of their current membership passes (other than those on the Abroad List) at all times without charge to Lord's, its Pavilion and Members' Friends' Enclosures for all cricket matches played at Lord's except where the Members entitled to vote have resolved otherwise by Resolution passed at a General Meeting by a Special Majority or where the Club is required to impose restrictions to comply with the provisions of its safety certificate or any other legal requirements.
2. To nominate and/or support a candidate for membership in accordance with Rules 3.1 and 3.4.
3. To receive notification of and attend General Meetings.
4. To vote on any Resolutions to be proposed at a General Meeting.
5. To be eligible for election or appointment to the MCC Committee.
6. To nominate (jointly with another Member entitled to vote) a Full Member for election to the MCC Committee.
7. To vote in a ballot for the election of members of the MCC Committee.
8. To be eligible for nomination as President.
9. To be eligible for appointment as Club Chairman, Treasurer or Trustee.
10. To be eligible to serve on any committee.
11. To join with other Members entitled to vote in requisitioning the consideration of a Resolution at an Annual General Meeting as referred to in Rule 20.3(ix).
12. To raise (together with another Member entitled to vote) a specific matter for discussion at an Annual General Meeting as referred to in Rule 20.3 (x).
13. To join with other Members entitled to vote in requisitioning the MCC Committee to call a Special General Meeting as referred to in Rule 21.
14. To share in the property and assets of the Club upon dissolution as referred to in Rule 26.

### (b) Privileges included or referred to within the Regulations

1. To use the outdoor nets at Lord's, subject to certain conditions (**Reg. II.d**).
2. To purchase Rover tickets for major match days (**Reg. III.d**).
3. For matches other than major matches and touring team matches, to introduce his or her spouse and sons and daughters under 14 years of age, into the Ground free of charge (**Reg. III.e(1)**).
4. For matches other than major matches, to introduce up to four guests, after payment of the ground admission charge where applicable, into the Members' Friends' Enclosures (**Reg. III.e(2)**).

5. For matches other than major matches, to introduce one person, over the age of 12 years, after payment of the ground admission charge where applicable, into the Pavilion (**Reg. III.e(3)**).
6. To propose, second or sponsor one Candidate for Membership per year (**Reg. III.i**).
7. To use the bars in the Pavilion (**Reg. IV.a(1)**).

### (c) Other Privileges of Membership

1. To wear the Club colours.
2. To use the car park subject to space being available.
3. To use the Tennis and Squash Courts.
4. To enter their children and grandchildren for Easter Coaching Courses.
5. To use the Members' Dining Room in the Thomas Lord Suite on major match days and apply for reservations in advance.
6. To apply for boxes.
7. To purchase, in advance of the public ballot, public stand tickets for major match days.
8. To participate in events organised by the Bridge, Golf, Chess and Backgammon Societies.
9. To receive mailings.
10. To attend the Anniversary Dinner, other Club Dinners and Lunches.
11. To attend General Meetings and Members' informal meetings.
12. To purchase items specifically designed for Members (e.g. umbrellas, Christmas cards).
13. To enter the Museum free of charge.
14. To attend a Lord's Tour free of charge.
15. To play cricket for MCC (if elected before 1 January 1972 or elected a Playing Member).
16. To partake of existing reciprocal arrangements at clubs with which such arrangements have been made.
17. If over 75 years of age and elected more than 30 years ago, to apply for a reserved seat on the Pavilion Concourse for major match days.
18. To purchase selected wines and champagnes.
19. To hire Pavilion rooms at discounted rates.
20. To join Members' Supporters' tours overseas.
21. To use the Library.
22. To apply for tickets for Members' Evenings.
23. To join Middlesex CCC at a reduced subscription.
24. To subscribe to the Debenture-Seat schemes.
25. To view, at Lord's, transcripts of General Meetings.

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
